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

Hispanic Serving Institutions (HSIs and eHSIs)

Hispanic Serving Institutions (HSIs)

- Federal definition: ≥ 25% Latinx FT students
- Not yet a primarily 4-year public university HSI in WA (as of 2022)
- 7 total higher education HSIs in WA (2021-22):
 - 1 private 4-year university: Heritage University
 - 1 private 2-year college: Perry Technical Institute
 - 5 community colleges: Big Bend, Columbia Basin, Walla Walla, Wenatchee Valley, Yakima Valley

Emerging HSIs (eHSIs)

- Definition: ≥ 15% Latinx FT students
- 13 higher education HSIs in WA (2021-22)
 - CWU is 1 of 4 public 4-year eHSIs in WA (EWU, UW Tacoma, WSU)




Hispanic Serving Institutions Data: 2021 - 2022

- 571 HSIs across 28 states, the District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico
- 401 emerging HSIs are located in 42 states and District of Columbia.

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HSI Status as a Funding Opportunity

Federal HSI funding is available. HSI institutions can apply for the following federal grants:

- <u>Developing Hispanic-Serving Institutions (DHSI)</u>; up to \$3,000,000 over five years
- Promoting Post Baccalaureate Opportunities for Hispanic Americans Program; up to \$3,000,000 over five years
- <u>Hispanic-Serving Institutions</u> STEM and Articulation Programs; up to \$4,999,804 over five years
- <u>National Science Foundation</u>- Improving Undergraduate STEM Education: up to \$3,000,000 over five years.
- <u>USDA- National Institute of Food and Agriculture Education Grants (HSI) Program up</u> to \$1,000,000






Figure 1. Slowing Growth in Number of U.S. High School Graduates, then Decline (U.S. Total High School Graduates)






Latinx Population as % of Statewide





Fast Facts


With the C/O 2013 as a starting point and the C/O 2019 as an endpoint:

- The number of White students graduating in four years fell by nearly 700.
- The number of Hispanic students graduating in four years increased by 5,045.
- The number of students (other than White or Hispanic) graduating in four years increased by 3,429.

2022-2023	610	383	63%



Latinx Student Equity and Belonging after COVID-19

Research from Latino & Latin America Studies' Director Prof. Torres García (2022) on <u>Latinx, low-income</u>, <u>and first-generation CWU students</u>:

- 85% of students have at least one safe space within CWU
- 62% of CWU students know whom to contact about services
- 86% at CWU say **pandemic negatively affected graduation** aspirations
- 79% at CWU often **feel overwhelmed** by academics
- 76% often stressed*
- 65% at CWU **"never"/"almost never" feel confident** handling schoolwork
